OAKLAND, Calif. – Asian Health Services (AHS) will be hosting its 8th annual Mayors Cup Charity Golf Tournament on July 9, 2018 at the Sequoyah Country Club in Oakland. The tournament will support a \$2 million capital campaign to construct a brand new state-of-the-art Pediatric & Family Care Center, a center that will not only help expand access to low-income children and families, but will also, within one year of opening, improve upon our initiative to provide health care to at least 3-4,000 new and unduplicated patients.

Oakland Mayor Libby Schaaf, is scheduled to attend for the 2nd year in a row along with other civic and business leaders. According to Mayor Schaaf, "I am excited to support the tournament to help AHS to expand its services to more Asian families and immigrant communities. The Pediatric & Family Care Center of Excellence will be a medical impact hub where social issues affecting health are addressed through innovative care and collaboration.
